A Message from Paston Melissa...

Dear church family and friends,

When everything is open and you personally feel safe to do anything you want with no precautions at all, what do you want to do first? Hop on a plane? Hug a stranger? Personally, I am looking forward to two things: 1) camping out for a couple hours at Starbucks with a chai tea latte with almond milk and that week's sermon draft and 2) singing in church at the top of my lungs. As the numbers in Indiana go down and the vaccines are becoming more and more available, the time for both these things is approaching. Our governor has announced that vaccines will be open to everyone over the age of 16 at the end of this month. This is a huge milestone towards all precautions being safely lifted.

In the meantime, we will keep all precautions in place within our church for a little while longer. Even as the masks move from mandate to advisory, we need to continue wearing our masks at church. We will continue to refrain from singing together as a congregation for just a little while longer. We won't gather together for coffee or a pot luck for just a few more months. We will do all these things, because we need to keep the church open to anyone who wants to come. When we choose to prematurely abandon all precautions, we make this church too dangerous for too many people. Unfortunately, the numbers in Elkhart County are climbing again, and we need to do all we can to keep those numbers down. The last thing we want is to have to do is move back online. Once all are vaccinated who want to be vaccinated, we will implement plans to remove the ribbon blocking off pews, to pull down masks, and to sing so loud they can hear us in Michigan. In April, we will be releasing a poll to assess where our congregation is on vaccines. This will help us plan a timeline for these exciting next steps.

One of the hard things for us to figure out this year has been how to worship without being able to sing together. As we enter the season of Easter, the upcoming sermon series will be called "Easter People, Raise Your Voices." We will be looking together at a series of stories of the earliest Christians to see how they raised their voices in praise and service of God, even without singing. As they navigated the formation of a new Church, something that had never existed before, each of these men and women were able to serve God in important ways. Be sure to join us on this journey through the story of the earliest times of the Church.
