Dear Dunlap family and friends,

On Monday of this week, we found a strange thing in the front of the church. For some reason, there was a big green chair in the front of the church. It was rather strange, because it was sitting nicely right on the sidewalk by US 33. We spent some time speculating about how it may have ended up on the side of that very busy street. Perhaps it fell off the back of a truck and somehow landed very nicely on its 4 feet. Perhaps someone decided to dump it and they saw an opportunity in the dark. Whether the chair's placement was intentional or accidental, the chair was now our problem.

How often in our lives are we handed a problem that we did not have any part of creating? At some point, this is just a part of being in community. in Elkhart, we are dealing with trains that were put in place long before most of us were even alive. Laws were created long ago to support the rights of the railways, and cities have to work with them. So now, Elkhart is working to create overpasses. In the church, we have to deal with the fact that the building was the designed without accessibility in mind. People in wheelchairs can only access portions of the building, some ways we can accommodate are by keeping many events and meetings in the sanctuary, and by maintaining a chair lift for those who can use it. We did not create either problem, but we are the ones who must find a way to be fruitful and thrive in this reality.

The blessing is that the opposite also holds true. While we do deal with problems that are not of our making, we also reap from a harvest sown by those who came before us. Jesus says in John 4:37-38, "Thus the saying 'One sows and another reaps' is true. I sent you to reap what you have not worked for. Others have done the hard work, and you have reaped the benefits of their labor." Those who came before us started this work, and it is our job to continue it. Others raised the money to build the building where we worship. Others had the dream to start a kindergarten that later became the preschool. Others taught the love of Christ to generations of children so today we have Sunday School teachers, ushers, and liturgists.

Whether we inherit problems or blessings, it is important that we recognize that the history of our church, our community, and our world shapes our lives today. It is then our responsibility to make the best decisions we can so that those who come after us inherit more blessings and fewer problems. On the work already begun, we can build and grow the Kingdom of God; on the work we are doing now, our great-grandchildren will do the same.
