Dear Dunlap family and friends,

On April 8, I took my son and met the rest of my family in Indianapolis to observe the total solar eclipse. This is something that no one older than me in my family will ever have a chance to see again, and if I see it, I will have to travel across the country. It was, for us, truly a once in a lifetime experience to sit in the darkness of an eclipse in the middle of an otherwise sunny day. I hope I never forget the excitement of that day. We went to the Children's Museum, where we sat on their miniature soccer field to watch. As totality hit, there was applause, gasps, and laughter of children. As many of you know, in my family, the event was made even more special as my sister was engaged as the moon covered the sun. It was an exciting day.

But then... this week, I learned via WNDU that anyone who went to the Children's Museum on April 8 was exposed to the measles. While we are all fully vaccinated, this led to panic, since some members of my family are immunocompromised, some are very old, and some are too young to have received all their shots. After panic, we began to research. We looked up the symptoms, when they would arrive, and what we can do in the meantime. It has been 15 days since our exposure at the time I am writing this, and at 21 days, we will be in the clear. There is absolutely nothing we can do at this time to protect the most vulnerable in our family, because those treatments should have taken places within 3-6 days of exposure. So, all we can do is wait and pray. What a way to put a damper on an otherwise incredible day!

The waiting and inability to do anything is incredibly difficult. No medication at this point can help. No amount of hand washing or wearing masks can protect us now. We can wait, and we can pray for those who are most at risk.

I tell you this story, because it makes me think about how we approach the General Conference. Every 4 years, the General Conference of the United Methodist Church is to meet to determine the official statements, practices, and beliefs of our denomination. That meeting began on April 23 and will continue through May 3. At this point, for the majority of United Methodists, all we can do is wait and pray. The voting for delegates to attend has already taken place. Our opportunity to make our voice heard has past. Now, we just have to trust that God is at work, and that the delegates will vote faithfully.

And so we wait. We pray. Will the delegates vote the way we hope or not? Will their votes disrupt our church and ministry here at Dunlap UMC, or will we be able to continue on as if nothing happened? We simply do not know. The waiting is hard, but it is where we are right now.

So, if you find yourself in a place where the waiting is causing great anxiety, I would encourage every person to spend time in prayer. Pray for the delegates, for the Bishops, for all the volunteers, and for all who will be affected by the decisions made in this 10 days span. Simply pray.
